

Extended Call for Applications

30 International Fellows in the College for Interdisciplinary Educational Research

As a consequence of the ongoing impact of the Covid 19-pandemic on the careers of young scientists, the CIDER Steering Committee has decided to adjust the criteria for applications for CIDER Cohort IV and to extend the application deadline.

The College for Interdisciplinary Educational Research (CIDER) is an international and interdisciplinary network of researchers in the field of education. The goals of CIDER are:

1. to promote interdisciplinary research in education,
2. to support public science,
3. to build an international cross-disciplinary research network in education,
4. to advance the academic careers of its fellows.

The college is part of the Leibniz Education Research Network (LERN) and started in 2013 with a first cohort of fellows. By December 2023, three cohorts will have completed the program successfully. Meanwhile, CIDER is well established in the field of educational research, and recognized for excellent interdisciplinary collaboration and successful promotion of scientific careers.

The college calls for applications for a fourth cohort of 30 excellent international junior scientists in educational science, psychology, economics, or sociology in their early post-doctoral stage. CIDER IV puts special emphasis on the transfer of scientific results into the public, by providing special workshops on public science, and promoting transfer activities of the fellows.

CIDER offers a wide range of activities, career support and funding opportunities to its fellows, including:

- Workshops on topics of educational research, with special focus on public science,
- The international CIDER-LERN Conference,
- Funding for interdisciplinary research collaborations on the main research areas of the college,
- Funding for transfer activities,
- CIDER Public Science Award for outstanding transfer activities,
- Networking opportunities with other fellows and experienced researchers,
- Mentoring by senior fellows.

The fellowship does not include employment at a LERN institute.

CIDER Cohort IV is scheduled from January 2024 to December 2026. Fellows are expected to participate in the above mentioned activities. The working language of the college is English. Required qualifications:

- postdoctoral scholars who received their PhD **not earlier than 2021**,
- Above-average degree in one of the following disciplines: education, psychology, economics, or sociology,
- Current employment (incl. scholarships) at a university or research institution in Europe,
- Research in the field of education or education-related issues,
- Special interest in transfer of scientific results into the public,
- Strong skills in quantitative methods of empirical social research,
- Strong interest in interdisciplinary collaboration on quantitative-empirical research projects (within the college),
- Excellent written and spoken English.

Application documents:

- CV and publication list,
- Copies of credentials (transcripts),
- Letter of interest (in English) with reference to the college's main research areas and the topic of public science,
- Two letters of reference (from senior researchers or other academic advisors, to be handed in by the applicant, in English or German),
- One published paper or a dissertation chapter (draft or completed).

Candidates with disabilities will be given preference if equally qualified.
